Covid Update

We continue to maintain our appropriate levels of hand sanitation and social distancing in our class bubbles. This is working very well. There has been a very noticeable engagement with social distancing and mask wearing at pick up times. This has enabled us to maintain an excellent level of attendance for all pupils.

Please continue to adhere to the guidance information.

Staggered arrival & pick up times

We are adhering to the Risk Assessment guidance for start of the day and end of the day procedures. This guidance has not been changed since August by the Education Authority.

This specifically states the need to stagger arrival and departure times to manage the level of social distancing and social interaction.

This has been approved by the school Governors and would have to be changed by them, subject to any subsequent change by the EA -risk assessment protocols. This is operating very successful around the school. The staggered times are in operation to enable the teachers to apply the appropriate hand sanitation procedures while entering/leaving the school.

Wet days

P1-3 children should proceed to the assembly hall, on wet days from 8:55 for 09:00am

P4 - 7 children should proceed to their classroom - 5 minutes before their allocated start time either at 8:40 or 8:55.

Please note children will not be supervised until five minutes before class starting times. Parents should continue to supervise until a member of staff assumes responsibility.

Changes to the school's operational hours

Planning, Preparation & Assessment Time Budget for teaching staff to be implemented from 27/11/2020

Under the agreed negotiations between the Dept. of Education. Education Authority & CCMS and the Trade Unions, Planning, Preparation and Assessment (PPA) Time Budget allowance were established for all teaching staff. 10% of a teacher's contracted hours are to be set aside for individual teacher planning, preparation and assessment tasks, alongside teaching allowance work allocations.

An individual teacher's time budget was due to commence on the 31st October as part of the contract negotiations.

A number of options were discussed by the Governors of St. Patricks, on 5th October, this included teacher non-contact time during the school day and the use of full non-contact days for each teacher, every 4 weeks. However, these options would have been disruptive to class teaching and were less cost effective.

It was agreed by the Governors that the following PPA arrangements would be implemented in St. Patricks and will be reviewed in June 2021

School will close for all pupils at 2pm, every Friday, commencing on 27th November 2020.

This is a popular PPA arrangement for several primary and post -primary schools, in the North down area. It was also a costneutral outcome and allowed for more collaboration amongst staff.

Covid regulations

Due to the current Covid regulations the following pick up times will be operating on a Friday only, at the same collection points.

P1, P2, P2/3 & P3, P4 will finish at 1:45pm, each Friday.

P4/5, P5, P6, P6/7 and P7 will finish at 2pm, each Friday.

Thank you for your co-operation in this matter.

Curriculum "Meetings" in October

There were over 400 hits on the class curriculum meeting power points.

Parent Teacher Meetings in Term 1: There has been a huge response to the PTM by phone. The staff have been encouraged by the responses to date and the very good feedback that they have received.

Assessment: CAT 4, Progress in Maths & Progress in English Assessments are on-going at this stage. This will enable the staff to baseline areas of the curriculum that need to additional focus, for the reminder of the year. Results will be shared with parents in due course, hopefully before the end of December.

COMMUNICATING WITH PARENTS

As a school community, we are focusing on the use of effective communication strategies to update and inform parents about school events and diary dates. We are attempting to give as much information about school events as possible and to ensure that the dates and times are all synchronised to avoid confusion.

(1) School website - long term

The school website is an excellent source of school information. It is regularly updated with diary dates via the calendar section. The calendar section can be uploaded to your phone by connecting to the google link on the diary page. School events are highlighted regularly throughout the year.

- (2) <u>Email via Teachers2parents</u> is the main source of short term information from school to home.
- (3) <u>Text message viaTeachers2parents</u> is the secondary source and is also used for quick messages to individual and specific classes as reminders.

The information services are working very efficiently; the number of emails not being received has been reduced to less than 10 parents in the school. We can see from the system who is receiving the emails and those that are being held.

- If you are not receiving emails, please contact the office to update your details, this also applies to any mobile number changes.
- (4) <u>See saw app</u> is used throughout the school by teachers to communicate directly with parents and get a response as required.
- (5) Letters/Notes We try to minimise the need for letters and notes but when we need a permission slip signed this will be in the form of a note. P1-3 parents can give permission via see-saw.
