SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT PLANNING

The School Development Plan (SDP) indicates the baseline assessment of were the school is at and the measures that are being put in place to enhance school based provision. The SDP has been updated to reflect the changes that we have all experienced during the lockdown of education.

In developing our plan, we have focused on distinct stages of school development. In September, we have focused on ensuring everyone has returned to school, feels safe and settled back into the environment, reconnecting with the routines of learning and how to learn. The summer scheme really helped the attendees reconnect with school.

In October, we will continue our recovery of learning and expanding the children's curriculum. This will help develop the pupil's creativity, and support a healthy mind and healthy body, we will also develop aspects of connected learning as a result of our experiences during lockdown.

The staff have analysed two sets of pupil data and identified areas that need additional support for the majority of pupils due to lockdown of 2020/21. These outcomes have been factored into our School Improvement Plans.

<u>P1-P6 Baseline Assessment Meetings</u>:-In normal circumstances, the staff would organise a baseline Parent Teacher meeting and discuss the outcomes of the GL assessments from November 2020 (school report) & June 2021 and map out the strengths and areas for improvement of each pupil. These meetings will take place remotely by a personal phone call from the class teacher. The "meeting" will take place w/b 18th October. Each class teacher will send out a schedule for parents to book their phone call appointment, via their SEE-SAW link. This will be uploaded no later than Monday 4th October.

SCHOOL DINNERS

FSM funding

Please note, that entitlement to Free school meals, is a factor in the school financial budget. If you feel you may be entitled to apply, please ask for the form at the office, even if, your child does not wish to go to school dinners. Additional funding is provided by DENI per FSM pupil.
