School Renovations

There have been lots of work going on at school this summer. The roofing refurbishment has been completed, all scaffolding has been removed.

The old floor tiles in P4, P4/5, P5, P6/7, P2/3 and the corridor have all been replaced with new vinyl flooring

P4 and P4/5 classrooms are in the process of being renovated. They are being decorated with new cupboards and window blinds. This work is running behind schedule and as a consequence P4 and p4/5 classes will operate from the school assembly hall for the first few days of term.

In the grounds the development of the outdoor learning area has continued over the summer. The fencing has been extended and the poly tunnel is in the process of being completed.

COVID UPDATE

Positive test result

If you have <u>symptoms of coronavirus</u>(COVID-19), however mild, you should stay at home and begin self-isolating.

Advice for those who test positive

If you have a positive COVID-19 test result, it's very likely that you have COVID-19 even if you do not have symptoms. This means you can pass on the infection.

If you have a positive COVID-19 test result, you should follow the advice below:

- stay at home and avoid contact with other people for **five days** after the day of the test, or from the day symptoms started (whichever was earlier).
- as children, tend to less infectious than adults, this period is reduced to three days for children and young people under 18 years of age.
- as a precautionary measure, you should avoid contact with people you know to be at higher risk from COVID-19 for 10 days especially those with a weakened immune system to make sure you are no longer infectious.
- do not visit others in a health or social care setting during this 10 day period.
- continue to take precautions, such as regularly washing your hands and wearing a face mask, particularly in crowded indoor places.
- let everyone in your household know about your positive COVID-19 test result as COVID-19 is infectious for up to two days before you begin to feel unwell, or the date of your test and it can take up to 10 days for infection to develop in close contacts
- tell anyone you had close contact to be aware of signs or symptoms during this time.

Testing to end self-isolation following a positive COVID-19 test is no longer advised.

How to get a free lateral flow test -

- If your GP or a healthcare professional has asked you to take a test
- you're working in or visiting high risk or vulnerable settings, for example care homes and hospital environments
- you're a carer who provides close personal care for someone who is at higher risk if they get COVID-19

You should not collect tests from a pharmacy if you have symptoms. You should <u>order online(external link opens in a new window / tab)</u> or ask someone who does not have symptoms to collect the lateral flow tests on your behalf. If you cannot use the online or pharmacy collect service, call 119 to order a lateral flow test (free from mobiles and landlines). **Lines are open:** Monday to Friday, from 8.00 am to 6.00 pm Saturday and Sunday, from 9.00 am to 1.00 pm

Free School Meals Entitlement (FSME)/ Uniform allowance

Please note that applications for these allowances should be made on an annual basis. FSME entitlement is used to provide additional funding into the school budget. Your child doesn't have to have the meal every school day or at all, if desired. Eligibility criteria is as follows:

Parent(s)/Guardian(s) can apply if your son or daughter is in full-time education and if you are in receipt of one of the following benefits: -

- ☐ Income Support;
- ☐ Income Based Jobseeker's Allowance:
- ☐ Income Related Employment and Support Allowance;
- ☐ Guarantee Element of State Pension Credit;
- ☐ Child Tax Credit or Working Tax Credit with an annual taxable income of £16,190 or less:
- □ Universal credit and have net household earnings not exceeding £14,000 per year.
