# New Arrival in St.Patrick's

### New appointments to the staff of St.Patrick's

Miss Natalie Johnston was appointed by the Governors to undertake Mrs. Orr's maternity leave from January to June 2020. Mrs Coyle has taken over the responsibility of Shared Education and Miss mc Keogh has taken over developing ICT.

The governors have also appointed the following permanent posts in the support staff, Mrs Lynsey Armstrong and Mrs Caroline Noble as P1 Classroom Assistants and Supervisory Assistants. Mrs Cathy Thompson has been appointed as the P2 Classroom Assistant and Supervisory Assistant.

We will also have two student teachers working in school, this term. Miss Rachel Mc Grattan will be working alongside Mrs Coyle and Mark Moss with Mr.Sherlock.

### **Developing Reading Skills**

As part of the School Development Plan the staff are continuing to focus on reading in 2020 and improve the children's comprehension skills. This supports the improvements made to the delivery of how we teach reading in the school. The teaching staff in P5, 6 and 7 are continuing to use Reciprocal Reading to develop the children's comprehension and interpretation of text.

# What is Reciprocal Reading?

In P5 -7, the focus of reading in class starts to move away from the Oxford Reading tree scheme towards independent reading and the introduction of novel based reading. Reciprocal Reading (RR) is used to develop the comprehension skills of the reader using any text type. It promotes a greater understanding of all text types. The reading group have a text at the instructional level.

RR improves understanding in reading by teaching children about the following strategies: - predicting, clarifying, questioning and summarising - key high order skills.

The purpose of RR is to help pupils to actively bring meaning to the written word. It uses their skills in problem-solving, managing information, working with others, self-management and being creative. Assessment for learning underpins the process pupils learn to monitor their own learning and thinking.

The children work in groups and are allocated a role i.e. A questioner, clarifier, predictor, a summariser and the big boss! P5

-7 Reading at Home for P5,6 and 7 children. Recommendation -at least 20 minutes each evening reading independently is crucial (fiction and non -fiction). Use some of the strategies i.e. Predicting, clarifying, questioning and summarising.

# Reading in P1-4

As part of our development of best practices in reading we have moved away from sending home the guided reading texts used in school. The main reason for this change was to enable the children to be engrossed in the guided reading texts in school as a learning tool/resource and not seen as a means to get to the next level in the scheme as quickly as possible. Guided reading texts are at an instructional level for each group. The feedback from staff in P1-4 regarding this change is very positive. As a staff, we feel that much more effective learning is taking place, in reading and writing in school. Please remember that reading at home is an opportunity to develop fluency, confidence and enjoyment for your child. Therefore, the readers sent home are just at the level below the instructional level and should be an easy read. Your child should also experience you participating and taking turns to read text with them (paired). There is a wide range of reading materials available, that don't have to be easy readers. Some examples are:

Oxford owls online, visits to the local library, local bookshops, audio books or online editions, or make their own reading materials by creating a story board, comic etc.

#### Writing

Writing is developed in two ways throughout the school. Each half term the classes focus on a form of writing. Non-fictional writing - these are recount, procedural/instructional, persuasive, report, and explanation. Fictional-narrative/creative and poetry.
